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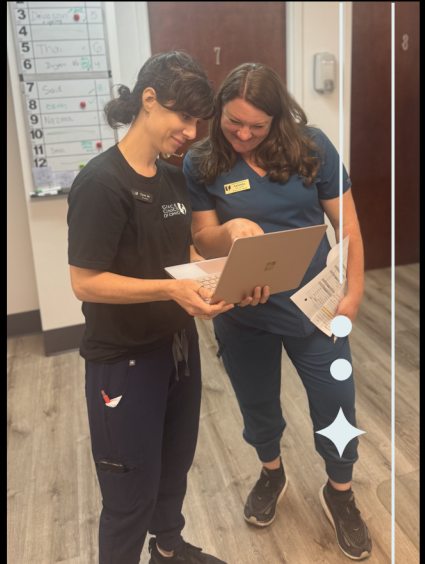
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EXECUTIVE SUMMARY

2025 HIGHLIGHTS + MILESTONES



This year marked continued growth in both impact and community support for Grace Clinics of Ohio. We celebrated our second annual Angels Among Us Gala and another successful Golf Outing, bringing together donors, volunteers, and advocates committed to expanding access to free healthcare.

Volunteer Tom Pike was recognized as Volunteer of the Year by the Charitable Healthcare Network (CHN), reflecting the dedication of those who serve alongside our mission each day.

We also strengthened partnerships with local hospital systems, churches, schools, nonprofit organizations, and community groups to better serve patients and families across our communities. For the first time in clinic history, Grace Clinics provided more than 300 free sports physicals for local students, helping remove barriers to participation in school athletics.

These milestones reflect the power of partnership in advancing compassionate, Christ-centered care for those we serve.

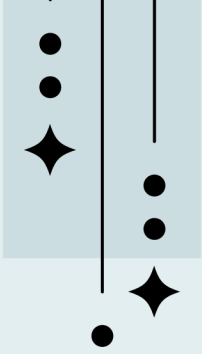

VOLUNTEER IMPACT

In 2025, volunteer engagement at Grace Clinics of Ohio continued to grow, strengthening our mission to provide high-quality care at no cost through the support of medical professionals, administrative teams, and compassionate hospitality volunteers.

This year, we transitioned to Bloomerang, a new volunteer management system that required significant upfront effort but has greatly improved coordination, streamlined communication, and enabled self-scheduling with clear service tracking.

As a result, more than 300 active volunteers served in 2025—from students to retirees, prayer partners to providers—each playing a vital role in expanding access to care in our communities.

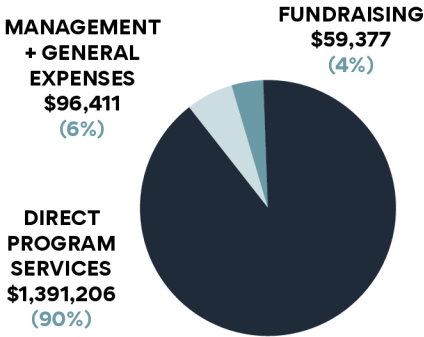

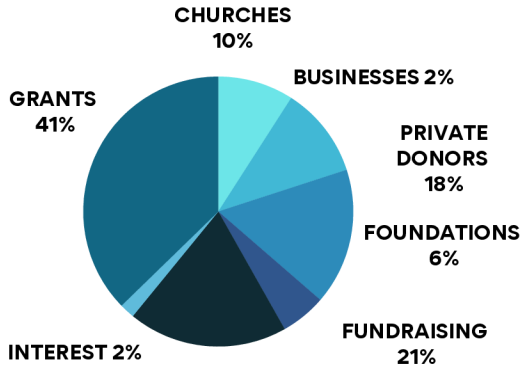
